 - Bible Book Review (BBR) on 1 & 2 Samuel (this is ONE BBR for both books)
 - All your notes on Systematic Theology, organized into a format most useful to you. (e.g., typed up if you took hand-written notes)
 - A 2-page essay double-spaced: "3-5 Ways I was Impacted Spiritually This Semester."
