Title

- ✓ Hebrew = Ezra, Nichemyah (הָחְמִיָּה, נְּחָמְיָה, Ezra = "Help"; Nehemiah = "Yahweh Comforts")
 - Originally one book; two books began during the time of the Reformation
- \checkmark Greek = Esdras Beta (ΕΣΔΡΑΣ Β; "Ezra Β")

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WHO—Authorship

 $\checkmark\,$ Most likely Ezra, the scribe, the son of Seriah, son of Azariah, \ldots , son of Azaron, the high priest

WHO—Audience

✓ To the Jewish remnant who have returned to Jerusalem after the exile in Babylon

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WHEN

- ✓ Dates of the Events—Decree of Cyrus (538 BC) to the second governorship of Nehemiah (430 BC)
- ✓ ~430 BC, after the walls of Jerusalem are rebuilt

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WHERE

- ✓ Jerusalem
- ✓ Temple is already built
- ✓ Walls needs to be established
- $\checkmark\,$ Walls become a physical representation for the people whose hearts need to be established

Introduction to Ezra-Nehemiah

WHY

To recount God's faithfulness to His promise to cause His people to return from exile to Jerusalem and rebuild the Temple and restore the city walls, but also to highlight Israel's lack of heart and effort in these tasks, signifying the need for a national, spiritual rebuilding and restoration of the people.
