- Author–Apostle Peter
- Date-early-mid 60s
- False Teachers of 2 Peter and Jude
 - Advocates of Immorality (2nd Peter 2:2, 13-14, 18-19; Jude 4, 8)

 - Boastful Claims (P, 2:18; J, 16)
 Greedy for Gain (P, 2:3, 14; J, 16)
 Blaspheme Angelic Beings (P, 2:10; J, 8)
 - Doomed to Destruction (P, 2:1, 3, 9, 12; J, 11, 13)

 Denying the one they professed as Master

Jude--Introduction

- Author–Jude, half-brother of Jesus (like James)
- Recipients—unknown church or churches for commendation but also warning
- Date–likely between 68-70 AD

 Purpose: Christian believers were called to earnestly contend for the Christian faith.
